Top 25 Poll

January 25, 2012

Atop the Pac-12, Cal takes over as the unanimous number one for the January CSCAA poll. The conference again shows its depth by showing four teams in the top 10 and ranking five teams in the top 25. Former number one Georgia falls to #5 as the SEC shows huge jumps with Florida moving up 7 spots to #2, Auburn jumping from number seven to #3, Tennessee from number fourteen to #10 and LSU nearly cracking the top 20 at #21. Indiana continues to dominate the Big Ten but falls to #12 as five other Big Ten Teams rank closely behind with Minnesota making the biggest jump of eight spots to land just behind Ohio State at #15. The Big Ten maintains the highest number of teams ranked in the top 25, once again showing six teams. Virginia out of the ACC, just misses the top 10 at #11, moving up one spot since the last poll and remaining the highest ranked team out of four ranked teams from the ACC. SMU maintains its #13 spot as the only ranked team from outside of the major conferences, while Louisville is the lone ranked team out of the Big East and maintains its stay in the top 25 coming in at #24.
